

RULES FOR CHILDREN'S PRESENCE IN THE PLAYROOM



1. Game room opening hours:
 - Monday - Sunday - **from 08:00 to 20:00**;
 - Admission of children ends in **30 minutes**. until the end of the Game Room.
2. Children **aged 0 to 4** are admitted to the DoreMini Playroom with a **medical certificate**.
3. Children are admitted only accompanied by one of their parents (legal representative), if necessary, parents can use the service of a paid babysitter.
4. In order to ensure safety and an individual approach to each child, no more than **20 children** can be admitted to the Playroom at the same time.
5. Before visiting the Playroom, it is necessary to take the child to the toilet room.
6. Parents are obliged to monitor and prevent children from fulfilling their natural needs in the playroom.
7. While in the Playroom, parents must remove their child's outerwear, shoes and jewelry.
8. It is recommended to bring a change of shoes and dress the child in accordance with the temperature regime in the playroom, taking into account the active play of children.
9. It is forbidden to bring into the Game Room sharp and other objects that can cause injuries, hand luggage, food, drinks, toys, money, documents and valuables.
10. It is forbidden to push each other, throw objects and use physical force to solve any problem; use obscene expressions and gestures towards any persons, make noise, disturb the rest of others.
11. The Administration is not responsible for lost or unattended items.
12. The recommended time of stay in the game room is no more than 2 hours.
13. The playroom can be visited by children who do not have obvious signs of respiratory and other diseases transmitted by airborne or other contact means.
14. It is forbidden to take toys, inventory and game equipment out of the territory of the Game Room.
15. Children are prohibited from committing actions that are dangerous for their own life and health and those around them while they are on the territory of the playroom and during any activities.
16. For intentional illegal actions, as well as for intentional damage to the property of the playroom or third parties, harming the life and health of third parties, committed by the child or his parents (legal representatives), parents (legal representatives) are responsible in accordance with current legislation, including including property liability for compensation for property damage caused to third parties, as well as damage caused to life and health of third parties.
